

CONSENT TO DISCLOSURE OF TAX RETURN INFORMATION

Throughout the year, we may receive requests for additional copies of your returns. Due to strict privacy guidelines promulgated by the IRS and Treasury Department, disclosure of return information without a signed authorization from the taxpayer is prohibited. Should you request a copy of your return be forwarded to a specified third party, providing John M. Hoffman CPA, PC a signed copy of this form is required.

Federal law requires this consent form be provided to you. Unless authorized by law, we cannot disclose, without your consent, your tax return information to third parties for purposes other than the preparation and filing of your tax return. If you consent to the disclosure of your tax return information, Federal law may not protect your tax return information from further use or distribution.

You are not required to complete this form. If we obtain your signature on this form by conditioning our services on your consent, your consent will not be valid. If you agree to the disclosure of your tax return information, your consent is valid for the amount of time that you specify. If you do not specify the duration of your consent, your consent is valid for one year.

If you do not wish to submit the signed authorization at this point, John M. Hoffman CPA, PC is required to obtain a signed consent form prior to any release of tax return information to third parties.
